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## Women's Resource Center Hosts Free Financial Sector "Career Connections" Webinar on July 15

Company representatives from Bank of America and Merrill Lynch will provide information about career pathways and employee development programs.

The expansion of the local financial sector job market has led employers to offer competitive wages that reflect the region's increased cost of living. "The yearly minimum rate of pay for a full-time Bank of America employee will increase to more than \$41,000 a year," explains Mike McCoy, the Sarasota/Manatee market president for Bank of America. "This does not include the value of our healthcare and wellness benefits, which are significant, additional components of the total rewards that all employees receive."

Career Connections are typically held as in-person events, but since the pandemic, WRC has moved these information sessions to be webinar- based. WRC also offers free virtual one-on-one career coaching along with resume assistance.
