## Women's Resource Center's Webinar **Highlights Preschool Education Jobs** August 25

(Sarasota-Manatee; August 10, 2021) Workforce shortages in the early education sector are creating a ripple effect as childcare providers cannot fill open positions and working parents cannot find facilities with available spots for their young children. "While many local sectors are currently experiencing severe labor shortages, a lack of childcare workers impacts a parent's ability to work in any field, thereby exacerbating the problem across the region," explains Lori Gentile, WRC's Director of Client Services. "Quality Pre-K and childcare providers with trained staff are essential elements of our regional economy and directly impact our labor participation rates."
